Overview

The course is aimed at familiarizing students with the main principles of research design and data analysis used in different areas of linguistics. We cover techniques in the preparation, implementation and documentation of academic work, as well as its dissemination.

We will survey various methods of gathering, quoting and reporting linguistic data. We will also comment on how we can successfully integrate data sources of different types, including interviews, questionnaires, corpus compilation and data from language acquisition research. We also address questions regarding publishing in linguistics. More specifically, we will briefly discuss different stages of writing an article and we will also talk about various venues for publishing scientific results.
